Welcome to the first edition of our WUTH Charity staff newsletter, where we will share charity news as well as details of funding opportunities available to all staff across all WUTH clinical areas, departments, and sites.

Thanks to donations, gifts left in wills and the hard work of our staff and community fundraisers taking part in the Charity's event calendar, we're able to fund a range of projects and activities to support patients and families, at Wirral University Teaching Hospitals.

Following a pause in decisions on applications to allow for a new <u>Charity Strategy</u> to be developed, including review of the grant process, we're pleased to announce we're now open for applications! Thank you to staff for your patience during this process.

The first opportunity to access funds under our new process is our small grant programme for projects under £2000 (including VAT).

We hope this new process makes applying for funds to the Charity simple for staff, with clear guidance and key dates for deadlines and decisions being provided. Our newly formed Grants Panel will review small grants.

What we have funded

We recently funded the new Adult Sensory Suite for the SEAL unit. With a specialist visual and sound facility such as a colour changing wall panel, a plinth with fibre optic lights, wall projector and interactive sound panel and special soft furnishings, the suite offers a relaxed environment to relieve the stress of visiting the hospital for adult patients with additional needs.

It's a brilliant example of how WUTH Charity works with staff to enhance the patients' and families' experiences. The project has been shortlisted for a HSJ Patient Safety Award and a Nursing Times Award.



The Charity was pleased to support the refurbishment of the restaurant at Arrowe Park Hospital and the creation of a new wellbeing space with a significant investment of over $\pounds400,000$. Funds were raised during the COVID-19 pandemic through the appeal launched and supported by our local newspaper, the Wirral Globe, local donations, grants secured from the national charity NHS Charities Together and WUTH. The Retreat, named by staff, opened in May 2022.
