HR Drop-In Support Available for Line Managers and Supervisors

Line Managers and Supervisors across Wirral University Teaching Hospital are being encouraged to make use of the HR Drop-In support sessions available throughout the week.

The sessions take place Monday to Friday at 10am via MS Teams and provide a supportive and informal opportunity for managers to access guidance, ask questions and discuss workplace challenges with the HR team.

The drop-in sessions cover a range of topics including:

- Attendance management support
- Help with difficult conversations
- Policy advice and guidance

Managers are encouraged to attend even if they are unsure where to start or simply want reassurance or advice on a particular issue.

The HR team has highlighted that there is “no such thing as a daft question” and colleagues are welcome to join the sessions for support and guidance whenever needed.
