His contribution extended far beyond the laboratory bench and included leading and supporting areas such as:

- Annual leave coordination
- Quality Management Systems

Clive was also recognised as someone who consistently lived the Trust values through his teamwork, professionalism and commitment to supporting colleagues.



For many, Clive became a trusted mentor and source of reassurance, particularly for Senior Biomedical Scientists newer to post, sharing his experience generously and helping support the development of others.

Outside work, Clive is a passionate Formula One fan and has previously attended the British Grand Prix. He enjoys staying active through running and has previously taken part in squash and cycling. He is also well known among colleagues as the laboratory's unofficial historian, often found enjoying a good book with a particular interest in history.

Retirement will bring new adventures, including volunteering at Ellesmere Port Boat Museum, spending more time at his allotment, where laboratory colleagues have gifted him a tree to plant as a lasting reminder of the team, and most importantly, enjoying more time with his family.
